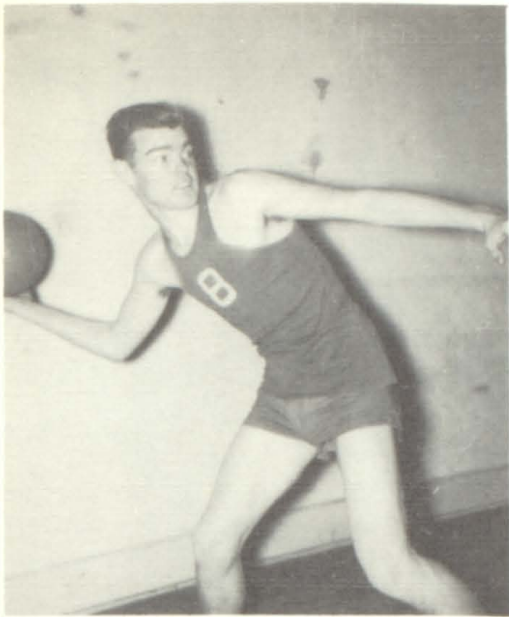
THOSE RUGGED BULLDOGS AT CAMP
