The 1929 Senior Class, the first to graduate from the newly built Buda High School, was far less in number than the 1968 seniors, who are the last graduates of Buda High School.

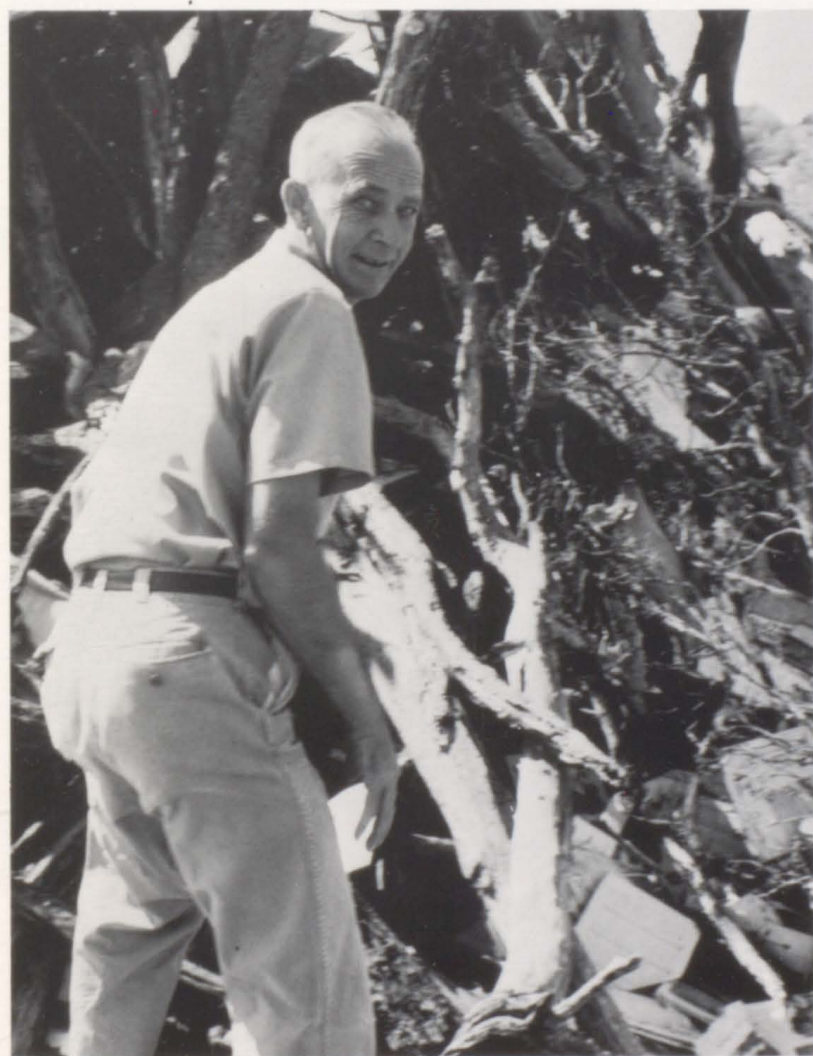






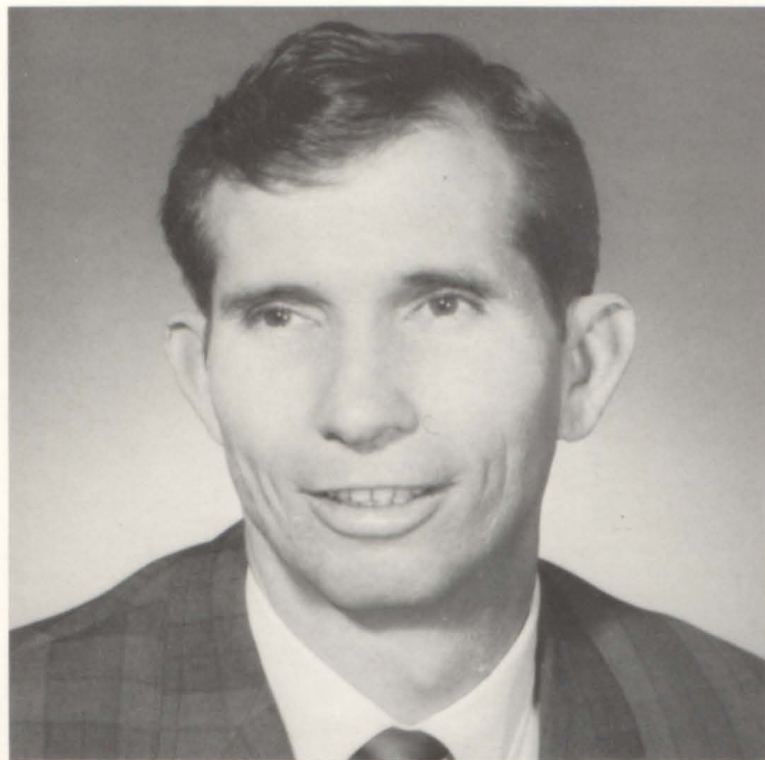

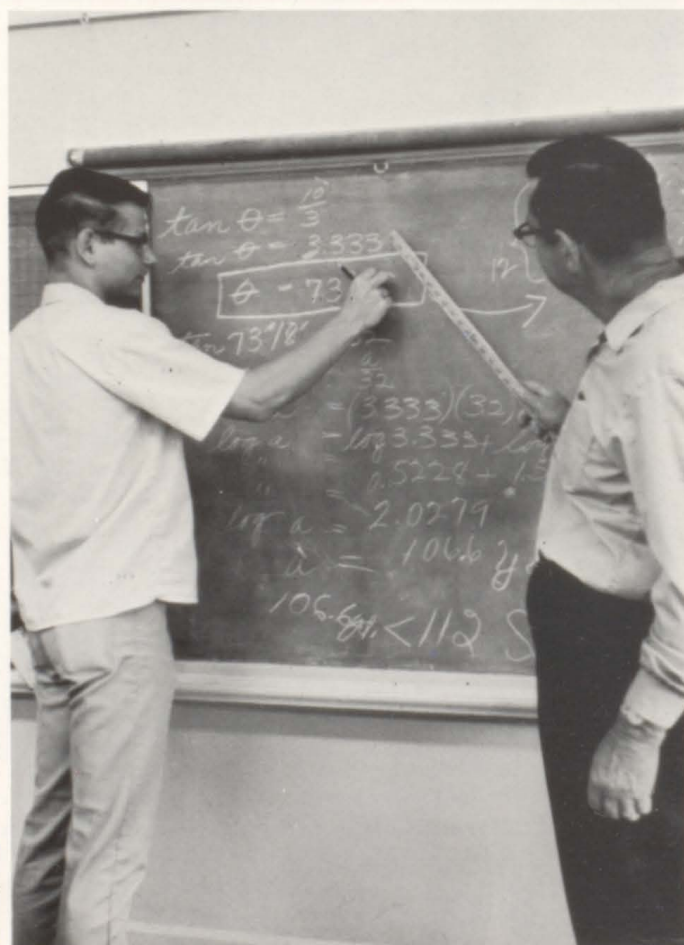

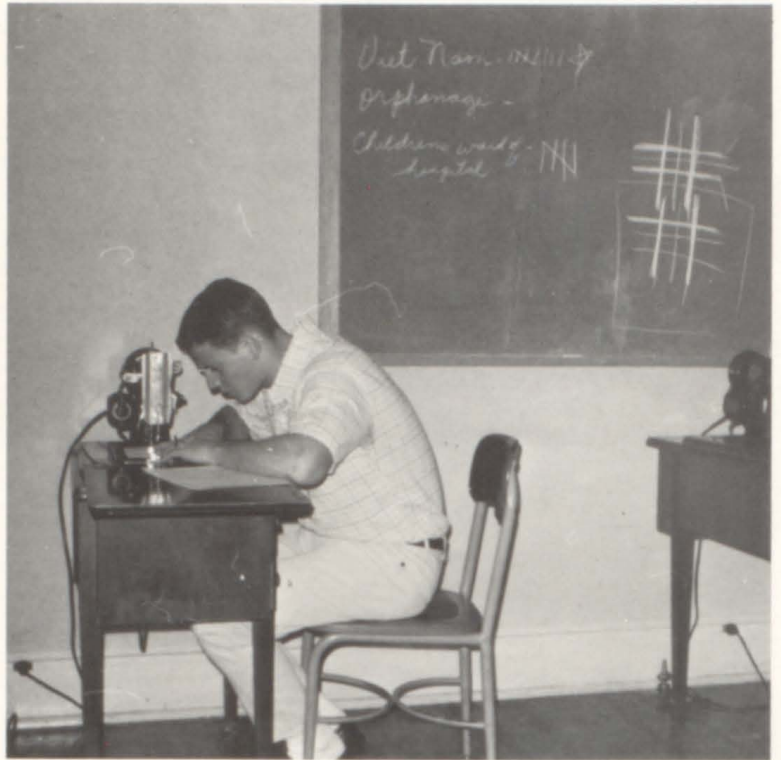

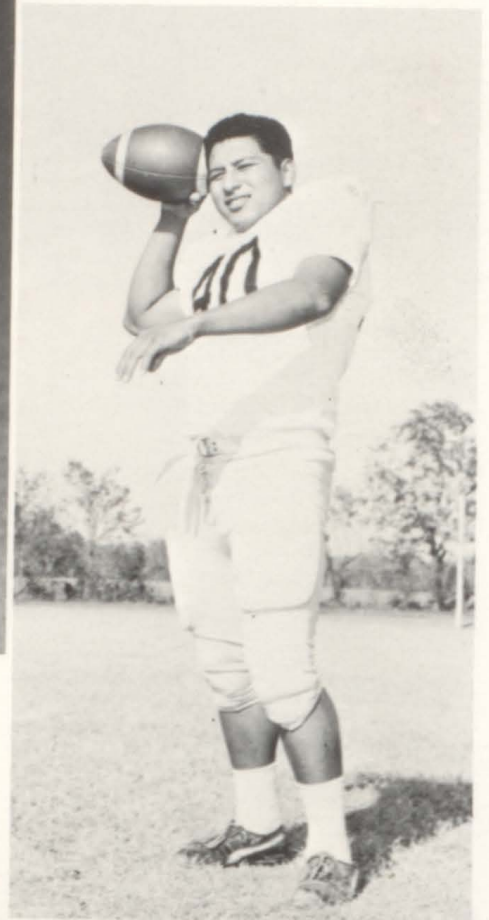
