2025 - 2026 Texas Minimum State Vaccine Requirements for Childcare and Pre-k Facilities

This chart summarizes the vaccine requirements incorporated in the Texas Administrative Code (TAC), Title 25 Health Services, §§97.61-97.72. This chart is not intended as a substitute for consulting the TAC, which has other provisions and details. The Department of State Health Services (DSHS) is granted authority to set immunization requirements for childcare facilities by the Human Resources Code, Chapter 42.

A child shall show acceptable evidence of vaccination prior to entry, attendance, or transfer to a childcare facility in Texas.

- Vaccines are required for students who attend the 2025-2026 school year.
- Vaccines must be updated as of the current age of your child
- Pre-K Vaccine Requirements

Child Nutrition

- Lunch menu available
- Free or reduced lunch for eligible students
- Support with going through the line
- Students may bring their own lunch
- Free/Reduced Lunch Applications will be available in August 2025.





Transportation

- Only available for eligible students under free State-funded Pre-K Program
- Fill out the Transportation form when registering online
- Register your student with SMART TAG
- Student must go to the school they are zoned for
- Access routing information after August 2025





Transportation

- Once registration is complete, it will take 2 weeks to process your request.
- If you register before July 31st, you will be able to receive transportation the first week of school.
- If you register after July 31st, you will receive transportation after the second week of school.





Special Education Services

- All students can apply for Pre-K
- Parent request for Speech/Special Education evaluation when registering for Pre-K will be processed after the first day of school.
- All procedures for Special Education referrals will be followed and not all requests will result in an evaluation.
- Students receiving private therapy will not always qualify for school therapy. Students need to be evaluated for eligibility in school.

Benefits of Pre-K

Academic Growth

- Children who participate in Pre-K programs are better prepared to start school.
- They score higher on reading and math tests in Kindergarten.

Social **Development**

- Children who attend Pre-K have better attendance, fewer behavior problems and make friends easily.
- Children are exposed to early learning activities that boost creativity, problem solving, and social development.

A Successful **Future**

 Pre-K students are more. likely to finish high school, get a job, and earn more money.

Attendance Matters in Pre-K

Once a student is enrolled in Pre-K, he/she must attend school and follow the exact compulsory attendance requirements like other Hays CISD students.

- Studies show that students who miss too many days in pre-kindergarten, kindergarten and first grade can struggle academically in later grades. They often have trouble mastering reading by the end of third grade.
- Preschool is a great time to start building a habit of good attendance. Studies show how poor attendance in preschool can predict absenteeism in later grades.
- By middle and high school chronic absence is a leading warning sign that a student will drop out.



Important Deadline



 To be considered for placement in a Pre-K classroom, your online registration application must be complete and verified by:

June 18, 2024

Placement Hierarchy



Priority of Placement Qualified/Eligible **Employee Tuition Community Tuition**

Campus placement will begin after July 5th providing enough time to notify your daycare before the first day of school on August 2025 within a 30-day-period.

Tuition Based Pre-K Options



Employee Tuition Based

- Hayeisd
- Hays CISD will offer an Employee Tuition Based Option for the 2025 2026 school year!
- Your child must be 4 years old on or before September 1, 2025
- Spots will be granted based on 100% completion of online registration application and verified documents on or before June 18, 2025
- Tuition Cost: \$100 Application Fee + monthly payment

Community Tuition Based

- Hays CISD will offer a Community Tuition Based Option for the 2025 2026 fine school year!
- Your child must be 4 years old on or before September 1, 2025
- First come/First served Based on AVAILABLE space
 - Spots will be granted based on 100% completion of online registration application and verified documents on or before June 18, 2025

Community Tuition Based

Hayeisd

- Tuition Cost
 - Estimated \$660/mo. (\$6160 annually)
 - There may be a slight increase or decrease based on the Texas Education
 Agency's confirmation of our new rate before the school year begins.
- Upon 100% completion of your application and required documents, you can pay a deposit of \$760 to prioritize your child seat and notify your daycare within the 30 day period.
