To plagiarize is defined as taking ideas and writings of another and passing them off as one's own. **Students caught plagiarizing will be given a ZERO for the assignment.**

Plagiarism includes...

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turning in someone else's **paper** as your own

copying a friend's paper 5 minutes before class (or having another teacher catch you copying work in his/her classroom)

failing to **cite** a source

copying an author's exact words and passing them off **as your own**

*All typed assignments must be in **12 pt., Times New Roman font,** double-spaced, and have 1" margins with your name, class period, and date in the top right corner with a centered title. HOMEWORK POLICIES



*Late work IS accepted for 70% (F) of the grade if turned in within 5 days of due date.. There is NO late work accepted after the that point.

*RETAKES?????:

In order to retake a test that you have failed, you must complete the test review and then come in before or after school to retake the test. You have **5** days after the initial test to retake the test.

*LIFE HAPPENS! If you

are having issues at school or at home, have a huge exam coming up, or realize you need more time to complete your absolute best work for any other legitimate reason, e-mail and request

an extension. You must come talk to me or e-mail me before the

assignment is due for the extension to be granted. You cannot come in 5 minutes before class without your assignment and expect an extension. I will not always allow this, so don't expect to always allow work to be late.



***ROUNDING** to the next highest grade will be considered ONLY if ALL assignments were completed and turned in (including test corrections), you are present (physically and mentally) consistently in class, and act like a decent human being (manners matter!). Your grade must end in .5–.9 to be eligible for rounding.

This does not mean a grade ending in .45 will be considered for rounding, as .45 \neq .5.

Semester grades are rounded according to the same policy. If you have any missing

 <u>assignments, do not expect a</u> rounded <u>grade.</u>

Please note, I will grade your late work when I have time. If my work isn't your priority, putting your grade in immediately is not mine. Asking me repeatedly to do it will NOT speed up the process.

ABSENTEE POLICY

YES — WE DID SOMETHING IMPORTANT WHILE YOU WERE ABSENT. It is your responsibility to check with us the day you return to class to find out what you missed or email while you are out. Check the WIRE SHELF or class website(s) to find any assignments and materials you missed.
